## OFFICER REPORTS

### President – Chris Harris

	<p>There are a number of things to address. I want to be as transparent as possible about the work of CHSSA. I will bring up points, and then if you want to discuss these at a later date you can send me a message.</p> <p>2. We no longer have a choice, and we have been hurt by Covid. We are in a crisis. We must do everything we can to get our numbers up in order to save the activity. I have dedicated myself to advancing the activity and hope you will as well as a member of this committee. We have lost a number of schools in different areas and we will need to get through this.</p> <p>3. There are a few people on this board who do a lot of work. I do not think this is sustainable. Being on the board is not a right, it is a privilege. We are going to ask you to do work and to get stuff done. We want this to be friendly, but we need to get work done on time. We should have a discussion about how</p>
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to enforce the completion of work.

4. Expectation and accountability for all members. You should read all documents that are in the shared drive to understand our rules and regulations, and the duty of care of the incorporated committee

5. Officers and Directors. We know who most of our office positions. Everyone else is a director. The attorney informed me that the officer positions are the only named positions in the by-laws. That makes it important to understand that no one is appointed to the board. Everyone is voted in as a director. We have an internal policy that if you hold a position that you automatically have a position on the board and that is not the case. California law is clear about representation on the board. Everyone on a California board is considered a working member and that means you are voted on, serve a term, and have duties to fulfill.

6. Working Smart. We are going to be asking board members to be doing work. If you are uncomfortable please reach out to me. I will be looking into technology tools in order to make our work process better. When I sit on boards we set up a Google Drive to serve as a permanent place for all files. I will give chairs access to add materials as necessary. For our state tournament if there are things we can do using technology please let me know.

7. We have a new address that is no longer attached to anyone's home as it has been in the past. The new address is in the drive.

8. We went to NFHS and narrowed the topics down to five potential topics. I want our vote from California to be representative of the will of the California community. If you feel strongly about including students, or not. Please let me know, chime in.

9. Board Registration. If you have anyone you want to add to the board, or anyone who would help to advance CHSSA, please lean on people who have similar interests and values as our board. We can include anyone on our board who we think should be added because they have legal skills or something. Accounting skills, attorney skills, etc. can all be added to the board. Maybe we should include representation from the UDLs or the NCFL/NSDA.

10. From the board registration people have suggested that we should digitize forms and registration. We definitely need to do that. I have already started to incorporate that. Someone else brought up that CHSSA needs to learn and align with other non-profits of similar capacities as our own. It is warranted to create a committee to research this. We need to pursue legal best practices and lean into researching this area.

11. We have spent a lot of time speaking about different rule changes in meeting. This prolongs meeting, and isn't the most efficient way to get a rule that everyone appreciates and agrees with. A lot of this work could be done on the committee level. We could incorporate committee town halls where a rule proposal is heard by the committee, and the committee then puts out a consensus of thoughts and adjusts the proposal. This allows the board to not have to squabble about how to vote, and may make these meetings shorter.

12. Student League Placement in the past has been based on where a school is located. We need to address how a student is determined to be seated in a specific league especially with the advent of online learning.

13. Website Improvement. Ben Cummings has been doing a great job on our website, but we can't just lean on Ben. If anyone has skills in this area. Just having someone who is a web designer can improve our website. Please reach out.

14. Student contact. Please do not have students contact our organization. We do not engage in student contact for the purpose of preventing any issues.

15. Chain and Channels. Please use proper chain of command to discuss any topics. Making proper channels clear will be important. Angelique works extremely hard. I didn't realize just how much work she does. I also didn't realize just how much work the president's job was. Easing the burden on Angelique by following proper chains or channels will allow our state tournament director be able to focus on the tournament more.

16. We want to provide Zoom access to all committees and chairs. We will buy the licenses. We can also switch ownership of the licenses for people to have meetings over Zoom.

17. The drive will become a central hub for everyone to access information. It will include reports, committee information, etc. This will include the directory.

18. The feasibility committee worked really hard this summer. I want to thank them for their work.

	Thank you! Discussions should be the bulk of our meeting to move the activity forward rather than chatting about rules and regulations.

**Vice President/Activities – Angelique Ronald**

<b>Angelique Ronald</b>	<p>State 2023 is April 21-23, at Carlsbad High School. Thank you to Minnia Curtis for hosting. We love heading to the beach. This tournament will be as fun as exciting as we can. We want to make this special. We are putting every intention into an in-person tournament. We may address some things as we get closer. Things such as the dance, or the masking policy may change as we get closer to the event.</p> <p>All physical mail needs to be sent with tracking. When we don’t receive tracking information and do not receive a payment, we cannot track where it went. If it has tracking we can extend grace that the check is late if USPS loses it. We have had several coaches or teams miss deadlines and tell us the check was in the mail, but then we receive a check that is dated after the deadline. This bottlenecks the tournament. Please get things done in a timely manner.</p> <p>There is a lot of legislation at this meeting. We have put in temporary rules year over year. This legislation will help us align the things that worked the last two years with our rules and regulations. This includes rules to make our tournament work with Tabroom more effectively.</p>
<b>Typed Meeting Minutes from Executive Board Report</b>	<p>It is my absolute pleasure to announce that <b>State 2023 will be April 21-23 at Carlsbad High School.</b> Thank you so much to Minnia Curtis and her entire team at Carlsbad for taking on this endeavor and welcoming us back to in-person competition for the first time in several years! I just know the amazing group at Carlsbad is going to make sure this is our most incredible State Championship yet.</p> <p>Here are some important date related to State 2023:</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">Leagues must submit their State Quals procedures to VPA: <b>Friday, January 6, 2023 by 5 PM</b></p>

	<p>Last date for a league State Qualifying Tournament: <b>Friday, March 24, 2023</b></p> <p>Leagues must complete Master Entry Sheets by: <b>Saturday, March 25, 2023 by 5 PM</b></p> <p>State Registration opens: <b>Wednesday March 1, 2023 at 5 PM</b></p> <p>State Registration closes: <b>Friday March 31, 2023 at 5 PM</b></p> <p>All paperwork and payments for State due by: <b>April 7, 2023 by 5 PM</b></p> <p>Please note that there will be absolutely no exceptions made for late payments or paperwork this year. <b>All physical payments (ie: actual checks) must be sent with tracking.</b> If you send a check without tracking and it gets eaten by the mail system, it's late and you will forfeit your spots to State– but if you send it with tracking and it gets eaten, then we have proof of that and can work with you. WITH PEACE AND LOVE, we've had far too many coaches these last few years claim a check was being held up by USPS, but then when we receive it. . . we clearly see the check is dated for well after the due date (and often not until after we emailed threatening to drop the team).</p> <p>If you know your finance office or district takes a while to cut you a check and fear you may miss the deadline, then please reach out to our Treasurer early (even before your Quals ends!) and she can help you get ahead of the paperwork. I will remind you of all of this many more times, I promise.</p> <p>—</p> <p>I recognize that I am presenting an almost comical level of legislation at this meeting and I would like to apologize for that. Over the last few years, we've not only been operating under temporary rules that allowed us to compete online, but we also switched from Joy of Tournaments to Tabroom and that has highlighted a number of issues that were existing in our rules. For most of those issues, we've been temporarily patching them over the last couple of years and need to formally codify the changes. It has been dozens of hours of work by some truly incredible people to get us caught up with these changes, so I am looking forward to getting these changes on the books. Specifically, I'd like to thank Chris Palmer from Tabroom for his tremendous help, Sarah Sherwood for her amazing help, and our IE Pitboss (Derek Yuill) and Debate Pitboss (Lexy Green) for their incredible help and insights, too.</p> <p>I'd like to thank our new President, Chris Harris, who has been working tirelessly to familiarize himself with the inner administrative and legal workings of our very complicated organization. That's not an easy task or a quick one, so, Chris, thank you for taking this on.</p> <p>Finally, welcome to our new board members! We're all so grateful to have you join us and look forward to working alongside you to create some truly awesome educational experiences for our always-deserving golden state competitors. <p><b>Minnia Curtis</b></p>	<p>I am excited to host this year, and make a great comeback for the state tournament.</p> <p>The curriculum board met this summer and we finally have a stable committee of dedicated members.</p> <p>People have been asking us for help for new coaches. This was something that someone on our committee already had. We would like to encourage people to go to the website to find materials that already exist. We need to publicize what we already have.</p> <p>Presidents please go back to your league and ask your league's what we still need to create. We don't want to recreate what is already there. Please ask your leagues what they need from us.</p> <p>If you have ideas for the state tournament please let us know.</p>
<b>Chris Harris</b>	<p>This work is really important. Please lean in to curriculum to share what you have. Any type of marketing or advertising or fundraising will require curriculum. We used to have great legislative activity in California. It should be a long-term goal for us to promote Speech and Debate positive legislation.</p>

	<p>Our priority is to gain, grow and maintain coaches, so, last year we had some awesome “Coaches Corners,” which were zoom meetings that allowed coaches to process a variety of subjects, from the building and growing of a team, to the realities of burn out, screen fatigue and implicit biases; turn out was great, however, due to heavy schedule conflicts and a desire to get the information into the hands of all that wanted it, recordings were made and disseminated for any and all to see. This is a practice that the committee will continue, however this year we are going to make it a priority to ensure a bit more “Make and Take” so that the “hands on learning” can be a focus; granting our coaches a bit more of “How To” of getting tabrooms links created, signing up for invitationals, etc.</p> <p>Those “Coaches Corners” will be on Thursday nights, from 7-8 p.m.</p> <p>This semester the following topics of conversation are the focus:</p> <p><b>September: ”Talking Tournaments” ... How to be in person at a tournament ...</b>  <b>October: Fundraising ... “Show Me The Money!”</b>  <b>November: Invitationals ... Navigating Travel and Tournaments</b>  <b>December: Creating Culture ... bonding, banquets/awards and all that bling!</b></p> <p>This is where you come in .. if there is something that you use every year, that is your “Go to” for whatever ... team bonding experiences, banquets, how to run a tournament in person... etc. Please send your awesome information to mikendra.mccoy@gmail.com . I will remove the school and personal information (if you want and if not, I will leave it so that people can reach out to you) and then create a document for coaches to use; a template if you will, so as to help us stop reinventing the wheel and make life a little easier for coaches to enter the field.</p> <p>In addition to these documents, the Public Relations team is going to host “office hours” weekly for the first few months, to have a space and place that coaches can go to for questions, comments, concerns, thoughts and support. With more tournaments using placards we think it would be good to keep everyone seated, and just holding up their placards.</p> <p>The other thing we are working on is to eliminate composite scoring. Composite scoring was established to manage power and rankings for semis to finals. You will only be carrying 3 scores from</p>
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	<p>prelims, and five for semis. This adds greater weight to the end of the tournament. I am open to listening to ideas about how to manage these concerns. Our opinion is the scores in semis and finals should matter the most. We could potentially drop prelims scores, but accepting ideas.</p>
<p><b>Typed Meeting Minutes from Executive Board Reports</b></p>	<p>First, I would like to welcome Chris Harris as our CHSSA board (bored) president. I appreciate all of his hard work as AREA 1 chair and look forward to his tenure as leader of the board.</p> <p>Thanks to Angelique for her equity suggestions that lead to our by-law revision proposal. It has been a long standing issue in congress of not being seen in the back of the room by presiding officers and hopefully the elimination of standing and the use of placards can create a more equitable environment for speaker recognition. **AD Hoc Feasibility Committee – Ben Fagan**

<p><b>Ben Fagan</b></p>	<p>Thank you to the committee for all the work you put in to this. We are proud of the product.</p> <p>The Ad Hoc committee was formed to answer two questions.</p> <p>Should the VP Activities duties be spun out into a role of an executive director employee position, and is it feasible for this position to be a paid job.</p> <p>The committee has prepared documents that are posted in the shared drive, please read through those.</p> <p>Leilani and Rosalyn put in a lot of work about how to make this person's life much easier. We have three recommendations and findings.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The VP Activities should be converted into an employee of the position. This would eliminate it as a board position, and would be converted to an executive director type position. We urge further study of what the scope of this job should be. There are many benefits to this being a permanent paid position. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Decentralizes the role of the VP Activities</li> <li>b. Promotes professionalization within the organization, specifically community facing work, fundraising, and structurally better as an organization.</li> </ol> </li> <li>2. As an employee, this person would need to be paid. We believe the employee should be paid on a sliding scale as the years go by. We believe this salary should start at \$30,000 a year, and then as responsibilities are increased on the role, this person should make up to \$100,000 a year. This person would be responsible for grant applications, fundraising, and revenue work.</li> <li>3. We need to raise dues. Dues have not been raised since 1999 as far as we could determine. Based on an inflation comparison we are massively undercharging based on the historical income of the organization. We are proposing that dues increase. Based on inflation we should be at \$175 dues but we are not proposing that large of a shift.</li> <li>4. We should move all meetings to fully online to save money.</li> <li>5. We should decentralize tournament director responsibilities so that Area Chairs and other officers can pick up duties. Another committee should be formed to better understand the role as it is created.</li> <li>6. Finally, we are not talking this year. We think this should spin off by 2024 to formalize exactly what this position should be. We believe a stronger professional core will help professionalize the work, and will make our work less reliant on the goodwill of volunteers.</li> </ol>
<p><b>Chris Harris</b></p>	<p>What would be the best frame for questions.</p>
<p><b>Ben Fagan</b></p>	<p>We can speak to content. If there are people who know things better we would love to turn things over to them.</p>
<p><b>Chris Harris</b></p>	<p>This committee worked pretty hard this summer, and met 4-5 times over summer. They gathered a ton of information, and put together a great report.</p>

	Moving forward are you proposing an Ad Hoc committee?
<b>Ben Fagan</b>	Yes, we think more constituents should be able to speak about this, and create a better understanding of the job description, a competitive job salary, etc.
<b>Chris Harris</b>	What title would the committee have?
<b>Ben Fagan</b>	We have not selected a name. If you are interested in how we collected information all of our raw data is available in the supplemental documents in the drive.

### 1. 0522-4: Judges Preference

<b>Angelique Ronald</b>	<p>In prelims and semi finals students are paneled in groups of seven. In our prelims and semis rounds scores of six or seven are converted to fives. The reason we do this is because it helps solve for problematic judges. It is an equity practice. If a student goes 1-1-7 because one judge disliked the piece for whatever reason that one rank could throw off the entire tournament for a student. This is fairly common to truncate scores at five to manage outlier judges. Jennifer is proposing that we do this for the entire tournament.</p> <p>To move forward on this we can move to call the previous question, table this bill, or open discussion.</p> <p>I would ask we not table this. We either need to pass this, or amend it so we count sevens for the entire tournament. Our IE pit boss, Derek Yuill approves of this.</p> <p>So is there a motion.</p>

<b>Leilani McHugh</b>	Is there a way to do a digital check in? I know a lot of judges are coaches who would prefer to be with their kids.
<b>Angelique Ronald</b>	We are asking for roll call, and then they can go back to ehri kids. I don't want everyone crowding into a room, but this is a five minute roll call.
<b>Lexy Green</b>	For mobility and Covid reasons having judges haul back to the room every round it's not something I really want to do. If there is a way to do an electronic sign in I think that would be great.
<b>Angelique Ronald</b>	I am down to make this better. It doesn't have to be a physical check-in. We can adjust as we figure it out.
<b>Erik Pielstick</b>	This has come up many times. The Tabroom program allows you to acknowledge you have received a ballot, and not start the round.
<b>Rosalyn Foster</b>	I think there is a change where it says on my way now that may be coming as an option now.
<b>Summer Calandra</b>	I think we do not have to codify. This extra layer adds anxiety and stress about their judges. If you were to not codify this we could still manage this when we have no shows.
<b>Angelique Ronald</b>	I always tell people I want your judges, not your money.
<b>Rosalyn Foster</b>	Call the previous question to end discussion

### 5. 0822-5: Debate Precedence in Pairing

If you look at A and B and they are equal, then E is also equal under our rules. The redundancy doesn't work. These new tie breaks were created with debate and Chris Palmer who builds tabroom. So the new system uses seeds to determine tie breaks by providing the tie break to the team that competed against higher ranked teams. In the past we have flipped a coin for some of these. There is also an option for a run-off. Tabroom can also generate random numbers for tie breaks. Lexy can share about this.
<b>Gregg Osborn</b>	Move to open discussion
<b>Sarah Sherwood</b>	Second
<b>Gregg Osborn</b>	Who determines the seeds, or how are those programmed?
<b>Angelique Ronald</b>	I work with Palmer to go through and program all of this in. It gives precedence in our pairing.
<b>Lexy Green</b>	Seeding is based on whatever we choose. First thing is number of ballots, or wins. At any tournament you can choose your tie-breaking methods. The tournament is set up to follow CHSSAs rules for tie breaks to set up seeding.
<b>Gregg Osborn</b>	Then how is this different than what Tabroom already does?
<b>Lexy Green</b>	Our tie-breakers aren't functional on Tabroom. Tabroom doesn't keep track of individual decisions, it does this overall seeding. It's what every other tournament is using. It doesn't collect that data and peg it to individual teams records.
<b>Angelique Ronald</b>	Joy of Tournaments couldn't do this either. Brent used to just sit and do it himself.
<b>Lexy Green</b>	We have so many tie break problems because we can't access C, D, and E tie breaks.
<b>Gregg Osborn</b>	Shouldn't our C, D, and E then be the further criteria that Tabroom uses to determine seeds? I get what you are saying, but what does Tabroom use for tie breaks? If you and I have the same number of ballots what does Tabroom what does tabroom do to solve it?
<b>Angelique Ronald</b>	It asks us to fix it for it. We have to go in and create a response to answer it. Our whole goal under C, D, and E is that whoever hit the harder teams should get to advance. We will instead move this to go off of seed.
<b>Sarah Sherwood</b>	I want to further clarify that ballots is step one, wins is step two. So all competitors will be seeded off of ballots and wins and those will determine seeds.
<b>Lexy Green</b>	This does mean that we are removing some tie breaks. There will be ties based on seed rankings and

	that would go to a random number, or coin flip draw. The only way to get away from that would be with speaker points. It isn't perfect but this will resolve most of our issues.
<b>Angelique Ronald</b>	Is there a better way to do this without speaker points?
<b>Lexy Green</b>	No. We don't have extra data
<b>Erik Pielstick</b>	It is random. In tabroom there is a point where the seeding is randomly assigned.
<b>Angelique Ronald</b>	I went back and forth on this with Chris Palmer. It happens often enough for us that it's a problem, we need to solve. It would be great if we could always run run off rounds.
<b>Steve Clemmons</b>	Call the previous question
<b>Lexy Green</b>	Second

### 6. 0822-6: Speech Power Pairing Starting Round 3

### 7. 0822-7: Replacement of Composite Scoring

<b>Author: Angelique Ronald</b>	I would like to screen share with you all to see what composite scoring is. If we have a round with three speakers and three judges we would look at all the judge ballots, and add that up to a cumulative score. A lower total score results in a better ranking. The problem is that, in everything but finals, we only look at the composite ranks. We only look at individual ballots for tie breakers. This legislation will eliminate composite scoring. Composite as a word is not in our rules. It is called a variety of other terms in the rules and regulations. This will instead just look at every individual score instead of the round ranks. Some may say this will amplify the voices of some bad actors. Instead, we believe that every round we will drop the worst score to eliminate the outlier. Many tournaments drop the worst ranked ballot when moving students forward in the tournament. We will also adjust violations by having the one rank adjustment occur on every ballot.
<b>David Matley</b>	Motion to open discussion
<b>Xavier Liu</b>	Second
	Unanimous Consent
<b>David Matley</b>	How do the power rankings work throughout the tournament? Are we using 9 judges throughout the prelims?
<b>Angelique Ronald</b>	Yes
<b>David Matley</b>	And we would be dropping one score so it would be 8 ballots to break to semis?
<b>Angelique Ronald</b>	Yes. This will also allow our semi and finals rounds to be more powerful because we will be increasing their impact by doubling them.
<b>David Matley</b>	I just need to know how many judges there will be and how we will determine our finalists. So if there are 8 ballots from prelims they are more important than semis because semis will have fewer ballots, and then finals will have more ballots.
<b>Xavier Liu</b>	One of the concerns we have is the third tie break of judge preference. In CFL when we had five speakers tied for the last spot we tried to put in judge preference. The issue we ran into was that, if they didn't hit other speakers in round, their judge pref was automatically zero. This meant that some students were pushed out simply for not being in a round with someone else.
<b>Angelique Ronald</b>	That shouldn't be happening that way. Chris Palmer and I spoke about this and he said this would work on Tabroom as Tabroom is written.
<b>Minnia Curtis</b>	Is this an easy thing to have tabroom do?
<b>Angelique Ronald</b>	Yes. Chris Palmer and I talked about having a dummy state tournament so league could use it for local tournaments. We do not expect you to use state tournament procedures for your tournaments.
<b>Gregg Osborn</b>	If we use CHSSA rules for our state qualifiers can we remove the multiplier in our league rules?
<b>Angelique Ronald</b>	Yes, you can make whatever choices your league wants to find qualifiers.

We will townhall legislation, and then committees will provide report on legislation to the board. We can avoid all of this negativity. I hope Angelique feels better.
<b>Angelique Ronald</b>	No, you can lead the meeting. You're the president.
<b>Minnia Curtis</b>	I think the meeting is running fine. I wish we had these ideas earlier than one week ago so we could share with our leagues. I also think that our discussion in these moments is important.
<b>Chris Harris</b>	To be clear, I don't want to shut down conversation, I want to expand it. So let's move forward with civility.

<b>Chris Harris</b>	Please remember to be respectful and kind to each other. The conversation in the chat room was less than great. Please be respectful and kind about people's feelings. I don't think I need to say anything else. I don't want to put people out there. Some people feel hurt and discouraged. I didn't pick up on anything, but I wasn't in the messages. If anyone feels hurt or discouraged please speak up to say something. Or, make a point to ask to share when something feels wrong. I never want to get into an
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	argument about whether someone is justifiably hurt. If they're hurt they're hurt. A person saying sorry is not always part of the healing process, but there should be an expectation that if folks make mistakes they're held accountable for it.
<b>Nicole Jennison</b>	Since I am new, up until this year I was a site union rep for our union and for all of our online zoom meetings we used Robert's Rules of Order but then also developed rules for online Zoom meetings. Are there established Zoom specific procedures on top of Robert's Rules of Order?
<b>Chris Harris</b>	Yes, we can incorporate other rules for this meeting. I was going to incorporate short rules for our debate. We are in an odd situation where we only have certain amount of time.
<b>Nicole Jennison</b>	One of the things that became standard procedure was defaulting to unanimous consent or general consent for legislation. We could formally adopt something so we aren't having to motion every time.
<b>Chris Harris</b>	We have to fit what used to be a whole weekend into a one day zoom meeting. This is actually moving along fairly quickly.
<b>Gregg Osborn</b>	You're asking a big question by asking about our meeting. A lot of this is moving along fast despite these being bigger questions.
<b>Chris Harris</b>	We have this perception that this is a sales job for legislation that helps run the state tournament. Angelique has put a lot of work in to this, and it's so we can have a good tournament.
<b>Dave Matley</b>	Best procedure is to introduce legislation, open for discussion, and then vote on it. We have been ending our discussions only when people were ready and done.

<b>Minnia Curtis</b>	Correct, this does not change any rules, just changes the name to declamation.
<b>Chris Harris</b>	It doesn't change our rules. There are differences between OI and Declamation for NCFL. It's good we are in line at least in name.
<b>Nicole Jennison</b>	I was just having to explain that it's called OI here, but it's declamation for all the resources online. It is a middle school event at the NSDA tournament. It's not a high school qualifying event.
<b>Tony Ugalde</b>	I meant to be clear. It's not a high school event at nationals. We just want our rules to align with the rules of declamation at the high school level. I know it's an event across the country. I just want to make sure it's just a name change.
<b>Minnia Curtis</b>	I am looking at the legislation and there are no changes to the OI Rules.

## 12. 0822-12: Increase CHSSA Dues

<b>Author: Rosaalyn Foster</b>	We expect this one to go back to your leagues. In looking at our finances there are some ways to pay for an executive director. We have not raised our dues since 1999. Adjusted for inflation that amount should be raised from the current \$100 to \$175.
<b>Artem Raskin</b>	I know that we need to discuss with our leagues. Just the fact that we haven't raised our fees does not seem to me to be a compelling argument. It could mean our fees are too low, or that they were too high in 1999. I think that looking at the budget would be a more compelling argument. I think we have the ability to hire a director with online meetings reducing meeting costs. I understand the need for membership dues, but in general I don't like high membership dues. They function as a regressive tax. For a large program it's nothing. For a small program \$150 is a much larger amount. I would ask for extra money about why it's important, and why raise dues instead of the state tournament entry fees?
<b>Rosalyn foster</b>	We don't have access to financials. Since we do not have the books from when Neal was in charge we only can look at what we have now. If anyone else from the committee would like to share please do.
<b>Leilani McHugh</b>	Raising per school instead of at the state tournament I cannot speak to right now. Since it seems we will be taking this back to schools, would it be taking place in 2023-24? There's a rationale for grandfathering in last year's \$100 rollover, and this would not be equitable to schools who did not qualify to state. It seems like this needs to be rolled out equitably. I understand some of the rationale is the problems that our treasurer is going through, but it seems part of this is making the money more trackable to make it easier on her personally.
<b>Chris Harris</b>	Real issue here is we have no money. We don't have money coming in, and it's going to cause us some trouble. The dues committee works together to let schools waive their fees if they have issues. I have also spoken with a dozen different coaches who have no problem paying \$150. Things are getting more expensive, and we are low on money. We have to be solvent.
<b>Eleanor Nishioka</b>	Dues used to be \$100 plus \$.02 per students in the school.
<b>Erik Pielstick</b>	I fully support raising the dues. I think that the way we have done things in the past this should be a discussion with the leagues. If this is about paying a director in the future then that needs to be clarified. We also should not be grandfathering anyone in. That seems really unfair to all the schools who didn't make it to state. You mention being on the dues committee, but I don't understand that there are school districts that can't come up with \$100 per year for CHSSA. It shouldn't matter how poor the kids are. It's the fact that we have districts who won't cough up \$100 for CHSSA.

<b>Minnia Curtis</b>	To make a financial decision like this without having the finances is not okay. I understand we need money for a future position we may or may not create but how are we in financial straits? We need to be able to say, here is how much money we have, here is what we need, and that needs to be with the financial information.
<b>Chris Harris</b>	We had a huge problem getting our books from our former treasurer and that has resulted in some issues. What we do know is we are operating in a deficit.
<b>Artem Raskin</b>	I think it is understandable that we don't have a budget, but I think raising dues without our budgets is irresponsible. I don't understand how we are in the red when it costs so much less to host an online tournament. I am inclined to table this.
<b>Dave Matley</b>	If there is a motion then we have to hear it.
<b>Artem Raskin</b>	I motion to table.
<b>Steve Clemmons</b>	I second
<b>Dave Matley</b>	We have to hear the motion to table, and discuss.
<b>Aaron Marquette</b>	I don't think we should table yet because we haven't heard from everyone who wants to speak.
<b>Artem Raskin</b>	Would it be easier to make the motion once discussion is over?
<b>Dave Matley</b>	You can't prematurely motion. But you can do whatever you want to discuss later once it is tabled. You can't delay the motion to table.
<b>Artem Raskin</b>	I withdraw my motion to table.
<b>Chris Harris</b>	Thank you Dave for making it clear.
<b>Steve Clemmons</b>	How can we repeal a motion when it has already had a second.
<b>Dave Matley</b>	If Artem agrees to withdraw his motion then we can all agree to that.
<b>Steve Clemmons</b>	I would like to continue the discussion.
<b>Aaron Marquette</b>	Another reason for the dues increases other organizations across the country have much higher dues than we do. All other reasons stand.
<b>Charlie Synn</b>	Related to the tabling of the motion, if the belief is based off of whatever information is available from the financials that we will be in a deficit, and if we continue to run at a deficit then we must be drawing down a rainy day fund. Whatever happens part of this discussion is not what the funds are for, but I agree that it is reasonable to raise the dues to \$150 because they have not been raised for 20 years. If we don't raise dues now then we forego our opportunity to fill our operating gap that we have been running in. It seems to have brought us to the brink of some significant financial hardship as an organization. If there are some schools that can't have programs because of this that is not a significant amount of money to stop a team from competing. What will end a program is a lack of a coach or lack of support. I argue to make this increase due to us running in the red and it's comparable to other states. We can re-address at a later time.
<b>Angelique Ronald</b>	Clarification about finances, for those who do not know I work in taxes and accounting, and I work with our tax person. There has been a lot of language used today that is not intentionally inflammatory. The status of our finances is not at the point of bankruptcy, insolvency, or anything like that. We work at a small negative take. We have more money from being online. In person we always ran at a slight deficit. The last year we do have more money because of the online tournaments. I do want to clarify, we are not on the cusp of bankruptcy, and we want to be clear that is not the case.
<b>Nicole Jennison</b>	Going back to what Leilani said earlier, if we pass this as is we will be grandfathering people in, and it is not equitable for schools who didn't roll over dues. Further, will this also raise judge bonds?
<b>Rosalyn Foster</b>	The next piece of legislation actually does precisely that and raises judge bonds.
<b>Leilani McHugh</b>	It sounds like you would like to have a vote today but several of us would like to go back to the leagues.

	Can we get a chance to go back to our leagues and still have an electronic vote? I agree with Artem it is irresponsible to move forward with this without a treasurer's report.
<b>Zack Kopecki</b>	Motion to call the previous question
	No Second
<b>Sarah Sherwood</b>	If we table this then we can pass the judge bond fees to state and then when we grandfather in the rollover then the \$150 fee increase would already be built into the rollovers.
<b>Leilani Mchugh</b>	This was just in rationale.
<b>Rosalyn Foster</b>	If the piece of legislation doesn't pass then we can bring it back in January.
<b>Dave Matley</b>	Motion to Table
<b>Steve Clemmons</b>	Second
<b>VOTE</b>	17 Yeas - 2 - Nays - 3 Abstentions
