





he love of words, and their power, was not lost on Sharon Prefontaine when she started speech in 1961 at Sunnyvale High

School. Her participation on the the speech team was the foundation of a career dedicated to the ability to express oneself, in both the classroom and the competitive arenas. The difficult dichotomy of that task has been a delicate balance; one that many of us have noted, as Sharon diligently and gracefully has navigated the often complex world of speech and debate.

During her time on the CHSSA Council, Sharon's passion for speech, and her profession as an educator, have remained paired like a champion Duo. Sharon served four years as the Vice President of Curriculum before becoming President of our organization. With curriculum and competition supporting and challenging one another, Sharon has kept her focus, always balancing the tools and trophies, ensuring that neither one is left behind. Speech education will always be her heart's cry and life's work. Sharon's poised confidence, passionate communication, and unwavering conviction have challenged others to reexamine their

own motivations, obstacles, and outcomes, in order to find ways to facilitate change and find solutions where they previously seemed impossible.

Coming to the council was a bit intimidating for me. Afterall, it was humbling to be in the presence of legends. The ability to listen and learn from those who have forged the way for the activity I love, and my participation in it, was surreal. Sharon was one that smiled, shared, and supported with such ease that it was obvious that she was a true educator. She taught me how to have the dignity and poise to know when to speak and when to bite my tongue; how to face opposition, but remain calm, focused, and driven. Sometimes Sharon spoke instruction, but at all times, she lived it. Those lessons are just a small part of her legacy. Her position as President is for a purpose, speech education, but she has never forgotten that this activity is about people and the relationships we foster.

Thank you, Sharon, for your years of dedication to each of us and the activity we all so deeply love. The CHSSA Council will shine a little less bright without you beside us.

If you have a question about a CHSSA rule or procedure, there is no one better to ask than Shirley Keller Firestone—and that should come as no surprise to anyone. Shirley has devoted her career to fostering speech and debate education in California. She has coached at Fremont and Homestead high schools and built and led one of the largest teams in the US at Lynbrook. Her students excelled in all speech and debate events, but her expertise in producing national and state winners in policy debate, Congress, advocacy, extemporaneous, and impromptu was most highly regarded. Shirley has brought this same leadership and service to CHSSA for over 20 years. She has served on the council as CFL president, representative-at-large, curriculum representative and, also, for two separate terms as Area I Chair. As a member of the curriculum committee, Shirley worked tirelessly on projects with

the committee, and in addition, on making her own creative lesson plans in impromptu and other events available to coaches around the state and nation. When considering bylaw changes at council meetings, she thought deeply about and contributed enthusiastically to discussions to understand the repercussions these changes might have on students, coaches, and programs.

She was always careful to advocate for those who were not there to speak for themselves. At state qualifying time, no other student scripts were checked and double-checked more carefully and thoroughly than those perused by Shirley. Shirley has said that she thanks her colleagues for great memories and we too are appreciative of her and say "Thank you" for representing us so well on CHSSA.

There was a time when forensic leagues were run by tough, no-nonsense women. They held strong opinions, backed up by an encyclopedic knowledge of the rules. They had high standards (for the kids and for the coaches). They worked us hard, but brought us treats. My high school debate coach was one of these women, and so is Linda Darling. Linda was league president when I was a new coach, and I don't know if I'd have survived without her. She saw an uncommitted noob, pulled me into the tab room, and put me to work. There's no better place to learn how a tournament functions than in front of a table of pink and yellow cards. There's no better place to learn the rules than on a protest committee with two veterans arguing over an interpretation of the by-laws. We learn to be better speakers by standing up in front of an audience, and we learn to be better leaders by being brought into the decision making process.

For over thirty years Linda has helped students and coaches become better people. She taught, she mentored, she sacrificed, and sometimes she laid bare the arm of the law. She organized tournaments, even after her school had cut their team. She served seventeen years on the State Council. She was a voice of objectivity on the protest committee – one of the most thankless jobs in CHSSA. She has earned a happy retirement, but oh how she will be missed.

Congratulations Papa Bear. Congratulations on 40 incredible years of creating countless lives. They all matter, and so will you...



Sanford Chandler, a longtime San Francisco High School teacher and champion of the fine art of competitive speech and debate, passed away on July 8, 2016 after a long illness at the age of 88 years young.

In his 35 year career at George Washington High School, he was willing to do anything to get students interested in joining the speech and debate team. When Mr. Chandler took over the team, called Masque and Gavel there were about 6 participants. At its peak in the 1990s, Mr. Chandler had a team of over 70 students that met after school during the week and went to speech and debate tournaments on weekends. Mr. Chandler coached state champions in Original Oratory, Humorous and Dramatic Interpretation, and took students to National championships 13 times. (A favorite number of his, since he was married on January 13th).

After Mr Chandler retired from George Washington High School, he coached at Riordan High School in San Francisco for over 7 years. After Mr. Chandler retired from Riordan High School, he ran middle school tournaments for public and Catholic schools in San Francisco, Marin, and San Mateo. (Sam Whiting, San Francisco Chronicle, July 15, 2016.)

When David Matley was inducted into the CHSSA Hall of Fame in 2012, he chose Sanford Chandler to introduce him. Dave Matley met the Coach when he was a student teacher at George Washington


High School Mr. Chandler's introduction was a highlight of the Awards presentation that year at the CHSSA State Tournament at Lowell High School. (Sharon Prefontaine CHSSA President)



60 YEARS OF CHSSA

Ten years ago, Hall of Fame coach Larry Smith accepted the challenge of writing 50 years of CHSSA history. In honor of our 60th, Larry put pen to paper and summed up the last decade of CHSSA changes

n 2007, I was asked to write a narrative history of CHSSA for a commemorative book for the 50th year of the organization. I combed

through 50 years of the California State Speech Council meeting minutes and other documents and managed to put together a historical account which was included in an impressive commemorative book. I never received any feedback on the effort, so I am not sure how many actually read it. Still, it was an amusing though daunting task. That task was made somewhat easier by the fact that I had attended those state speech council meetings for over 25 years, so I could bring personal anecdotes into the narrative to make it, I hoped, more interesting.

This year CHSSA will observe a 60th anniversary tournament. Yes, I know. Someone who is not math challenged figured out the 2008 tournament was actually the 51st state tournament since the first one in 1958 had to be counted as number one. Ron Underwood, Historian for CHSSA, asked if I would write an update history of the organization since 2007-2008. I accepted the challenge, again. That meant reading through all the California State Speech Council meeting minutes, the Speech Bulletins, and the state tournament programs to glean an update sequel of sorts to the history

of the organization. I can tell you reading the minutes of all those meetings is mind numbing. Only speech/debate coaches could spend hours each meeting parsing the meaning of a word or a proposed rule change.

I will try to condense this as much as possible to what seems to be of the most significance of the past decade.

CHSSA Embraces 21st Century Technology

CHSSA now has a very impressive web page where coaches and others can find important information about the state tournament and valuable curriculum materials. The site also includes access to instructional DVDs produced under the direction of V.P. of Curriculum, Rita Prichard, Hall of Fame video interviews, and much more.

The state tournament has begun utilizing computers for many tasks, including paneling and tabulating of rounds and judge assignments.

A text message system for updates and announcements on all events and judging reminders is available at the state tournament.

CHSSA has a Facebook page where postings are made about CHSSA.

Much of the entry for the state tournament is now conducted digitally.

Larry's first teaching job was drama and English at Mt. Whitney High School in Visalia (taking the position left by Shirley Keller; who also went on to be a California and NSDA Hall of Famer). Ultimately ending up at Hoover High in Fresno, Larry taught and coached speech and debate from 1967 until his retirement in 1996. He served in many CHSSA positions: Area II Chairperson, VP Activities, President from 1977 to 1980, and Treasurer from 1980 until 2000. He was also an NSDA District Chairperson for thirteen years.

Larry was a triple diamond NSDA coach; Teacher of the Year in Fresno Unified; and was awarded the NSDA Ralph Carey District Chair National Award. When asked whether his twenty-eight years in forensics were worth it, he was quick to reply, "You bet, but I'm happy to relinquish the reins to younger folk." Speaking to coaches, he continued, "Just remember, what you are doing is providing the skills and confidence they need to survive in life.

Teach them first. Coach them second.

Winning plastic trophies massages the ego. Seeing future success because of what you taught provides the satisfaction that you did your job properly and well..." For his commitment to the forensics community and its students Larry Smith was inducted into the National Speech And Debate Association Hall of Fame in 1996 and the California High School Speech Association Hall of Fame in 1988.

The members of the State Speech Council all utilize electronic communications extensively, including at meetings, and in exchanging documents necessary to conduct the meetings.

Laptop computers are now allowed for use in all policy and Lincoln Douglas debates and Public Forum. Laptops may also be utilized in extemporaneous preprooms. Parliamentary contestants may use computers in the preproom but may take only one colored piece of paper provided by the preproom with hand written notes into a round.

Some payments to CHSSA may now be done via credit card.

Financial things

The school membership was set at \$100 per year, eliminating the previous \$50 + ADA assessment. In order to encourage better prepared and more motivated Presiding Officers, the first place P.O. will receive a large gavel and a

\$500 award. The second place P.O. a plaque and a \$200 award. The award amounts will be in memory of Bob DeGroff who conducted the state congress for years.

Coaches can now "roll over" their \$100 judge deposit at the tournament to pay for their school's next year membership, or ask for a check refund, which will be paid to their league president at the May meeting of the CSSC for distribution to those who request a check. It would seem to be a better system than writing individual checks, provided most want to roll over the amount.

(I have to inject a comment here. For years I served as treasurer and sat glued to a chair all day the last day of the tournament laboriously writing judge refund checks. I was the most popular guy on campus. When the fee went to \$100 I simplified things by just getting \$14,000 in \$100 traveler's checks and handing those out. It was always amusing to see the look on

the teller's face when I said, as I signed 140 checks, "I'm going to spend all this next weekend.").

Curriculum development

In 1973, two new Vice Presidents were added to the Executive Council: Vice President Activities, who would be in charge of competitive activities, and Vice President Curriculum, who would be in charge of curriculum development and distribution.

CHSSA is an educational organization, and at least half of their efforts should be towards that end. Since that time there has been an ongoing and dedicated effort to develop curriculum materials. It is in the past decade that curriculum development under the superb direction of VP Rita Prichard has been prolifically expanded, especially into modern digital format. Rita retired at the end of the 2015-2016 school year. Martha Managhas was elected to the VP Curriculum position to carry on



this important work.

Most notably in the past decade: A set of DVD instructional videos on competitive events was produced: Expository Speaking, Original Advocacy, Student Congress, Thematic Interpretation, Original Prose-Poetry, Impromptu Speaking, Oratorical Interpretation, Parliamentary Debate, and Judging Instructions for all debate, individual events, and congress events. These videos are professional quality productions. Also produced and updated are a Coaching Handbook and a Student Handbook.

For speech classroom instructional materials the book "Speaking Across the Curriculum" edited by former V.P. Curriculum Lynette Williamson has been widely distributed. It is available on Amazon.The curriculum committee has turned its attention to developing teaching materials to fit into the Common Core educational framework adopted across the state. One les-

son on advocacy writing has been produced and posted on the website. Also made available is a guide to MLA formatting for writing of speeches or compositions. Access to all of these outstanding products can be found on the CHSSA website,

Competitive event changes

As noted at the beginning, the California State Speech Council spends countless hours tweaking and changing the rules for competitive events. Often these tweaks and changes are because some competitor or coach has found some way to bend or circumvent established rules. Ongoing, it seems for decades, are discussions and decisions about what a "published source" for interpretation selections means, which has been complicated by the proliferation of materials found on the internet. Most of the changes to rules have been previously distributed, so I chose to

note only some I considered substantively important.

In 2010 the newest debate events, Parliamentary Debate and Public Forum Debate, were both allowed 48 entries to the state tournament. (The September 2016 CSSC meeting: The Debate Committee announced they would be presenting a proposal to make all debate events entries 64 with a guaranteed four rounds to all entered).

In 2012-13 The Congress Committee recommended congress session preliminary rounds be reduced from four to three. There was also a concern about the "quality" of Presiding Officers, hence the \$500 honorarium for the first place PO and \$250 for the second place PO was recommended and adopted.

For decades it was an assumed "rule" that all judging panels had to include one college student, one lay person, and one coach.

That was placed into the By Laws eventually (I can't find the date), and that directive for those assigning judges became a guideline. That complicated the task for those assigning judges, and in 2011 the requirement for a 1-1-1 panel was eliminated.

(Again, I have to insert a personal anecdote. In 1974, I directed my first tournament at Fresno State as Area II Chairperson. We had a serious judge availability problem the year before, and I was determined that that would not happen. I and my fellow local coaches had recruited the exact number needed for Round I and II of debate, all attorneys, who had volunteered to judge the first two rounds of debate. Parings for Round I were sent to the judge assignment house. Then...nothing happened. I went to find out the issue, and those assigning judges were attempting to panel the one college student, one lay person, one coach on the mistaken assumption that was the rule. It was not the rule at that time. I had a roomful of impatient attorneys. I told the assignment coaches to use them. ALL of them. They did. And a number of coaches assigned to the round were pleased to be off the task.)

The other substantive changes to competitive events was previously noted: allowance of the use of computers in Policy debate, LD and Public Forum, and in Parliamentary Prep and Extemporaneous Prep.

Public Relations

The Public Relations Committee was reestablished in 2010 along with a new executive board member, Vice

President Public Relations. Mikendra McCoy accepted the position.

The committee has multiple tasks:

To find sponsors for the organization: soliciting monetary or services contributions for the state tournament or for scholarships

To manage the CHSSA web page and find other internet options for communication by coaches, teachers, or students.

The committee established a Facebook page for CHSSA

To lobby influential people regarding the absence of a teaching credential for speech/debate. Also to lobby for the University of California to accept speech classes in its entrance required "a-f" course requirements. (These are ongoing perennial issues that have been a Sisyphean task since the 1970's.)

To develop CHSSA branded items for sale at the state tournament or on line.

To develop a new CHSSA logo. That effort was successful and adopted in 2015 and trademarked.

In Honor of Those Icons Lost from the California State Speech Council

The California State Speech Council has been blessed with highly dedicated elected officers for decades. Many of these individuals served the organization in different offices holding their positions for extended


periods of time. It is that stability in leadership at the top that has allowed

periods of time. It is that stability in leadership at the top that has allowed the organization to continue to provide outstanding state tournaments and impressive curriculum materials. I noted reading the minutes of one meeting the majority of those coaching forensics in California have ten or fewer years of experience. Those that we have lost in the past decade counted their service in decades, and thus their loss is a considerable one to the organization. These individuals are truly deserving of the label "Icons."



CARMENDALE FERNANDES

Carm, as we all knew her, was one of the founding members of the California State Speech Council in 1957-58. Carm served various offices in the organization, most notably as president and public relations vice president. She also served on the executive committee and as president of the National Forensic League (NSDA). Her network of contacts over the decades helped immensely with the acquiring of hotels and meeting rooms for the CSSC meetings and for state tournaments. Carmendale was well known and well loved by her fellow coaches and her hundreds of former students.



Carm was a Founding member of both the CHSSA Hall of Fame and the NSDA Hall of Fame. When Carm retired from the CSSC in 2009 she had served the Speech Council for 51 years. Carm passed away shortly after her 90th birthday celebration in 2014.



DONOVAN CUMMINGS

Donovan joined the CSSC in 1963. Don wore virtually every hat as he dedicated his life to helping the CHS-SA become a strong organization. He served at various times as a League President, as Area Chair, as Editor, as VP Activities, as President (twice), as VP Curriculum, as Historian. Donovan along with Tom Montgomery (deceased) wrote the "California Plan" for scoring individual events at the NFL (NSDA) tournament, convincing the organization that the cumulative score plan was far more equitable and fair than the up/down system they had used for decades. Don and Tom ran the NFL individual events tab room for several years to "train" NFL coaches to use the system. Don was a member of the CHSSA Hall of Fame and the NFL (NSDA) Hall of Fame. Don retired from the State Speech Council in 2008 as

as the longest serving member, 1963-2008, 45 years. He passed away in 2010.



JOHN CARDOZA

John served as Secretary for the CSSC 1986-1998, and as President 1998-2004. He was inducted into the CHSSA Hall of Fame in 1995. He served on the CSSC for 18 years. John's favorite goodbye was, "Be good, play nice, don't fight, and share your toys." As his health failed his former students came from all over the U.S. to spend a little time with him. John passed away in 2016.

Notable Retirements

Chuck Ballingall resigned the position of Secretary of the CSSC in 2013 after serving since 2005. Chuck is a member of both the CHSSA Hall of Fame and the NSDA Hall of Fame.

Rita Pritchard retired at the end of the 2015-16 year. Rita had served since 2004 as VP Curriculum. Rita is a member of the CHSSA Hall of Fame. Her time as VP Curriculum was one of the most productive ever.

Suzanne Munsell resigned as Area IV Chairperson effective at the end of the 2016-2017 year. Suzanne has served since 2007 as the Chairperson and prior to that had served as a league president and other positions dating back to the 1980's. Suzanne is a member of the CHSSA Hall of Fame.

Natalie Weber is the only surviving member of the original 1957-58 group of coaches who founded the CSSC-CHSSA. She served for years on the CSSC, most importantly as VP Curriculum. Nan, as she was known, arranged and hosted the tournament post dinner-dance for three decades prior to her official "retirement" from the organization in 2009. Nan is a member of the Hall of Fame in both the NSDA and CHSSA.

Honors and Recognitions

In 2010, the Donovan Cummings Service Above Self Award honor was established. The award is presented to someone who has gone above and beyond in service to others in the speech and debate community. To date the honorees are: 2010 Gay Brasher, 2011 Ron Underwood, 2012 Rita Prichard, 2013 Nermin Fraser, 2014 Hoon Ko, and 2016 Mikendra McCoy.

Scholarship Donations

A \$500 amount matched by CHSSA provided a scholarship of \$1,000 honoring Lynette Williamson who served as Vice President Curriculum 2000-2004. It is awarded to the impromptu speaker who gives the most inspirational and original impromptu speech, as voted upon by students.

A \$1,000 scholarship from the California Librarians Association was donated in 2016. The award went to the top Expository speech.

Closing Ruminations

From the minutes of the September 2015 meeting: President Sharon Prefontaine told those at the California State Speech Council meeting, "I am concerned about our purpose. What are we about? What direction are we going? We must create a sense of unity as we move forward. What type of competition do we encourage? The demands on teachers are huge and revenue has decreased. We are volunteers... your time is critical. Where do we fit?"

She announced that the January meeting would not be legislative in nature and invited the group to craft some plans for a meeting that would break into groups to discuss the future of the organization. In January 2016 the Council spent a day working in group "brain storming" sessions to provide suggestions for the future of



expenses to come to Fresno, in August, for a day of meetings. Around 15 brave and dedicated souls were willing to endure the triple digit heat. I booked a hotel a few blocks from my home for Friday and Saturday nights and a meeting room for Saturday. We all had a tri tip barbecue and adult beverages at my home Friday night. It seemed to be a productive meeting.)

I noted earlier that the California State Speech Council, the governing body of CHSSA,

has enjoyed and benefited from dedicated teachers who have given up hours and hours of their time to the organization. They put in long hours at three meetings per year, put in long hours administering the state tournament, and often put in long hours of their time while at home tending to the tasks required of their offices.

Looking at the State Council page in the 2016 State Tournament program I find an amazing statistic. The eleven people pictured have a combined 310 years of experience in education, many of those years serving on the State Council. I also liked the matriarchy aspect of the State Council leadership. Seven of the ten positions were held by very competent and dedicated women.

In the epilogue closing of the 50 year history I wrote in 2007 I noted, "New faces appear on the council beginning as league presidents or curriculum representatives or representatives at large. Mostly these new faces are eager and enthusiastic about conducting the business of the CHSSA. Too often, however, youthful enthusiasm must be channeled.

Those with personal agendas need to understand the history and the workings of the organization before they 'willy-nilly' offer suggestions for changes. In short, they need some sort of 'adult' supervision."

The stability in leadership has been marvelously consistent and competent the last ten years. However, as this brief history has noted, many who for years contributed to that stability are no longer sitting in those chairs.

It is my hope that those now holding positions as league presidents, curriculum reps, or reps at large will aspire to remain dedicated and active. The comment that I read about many coaches having less than ten years of experience coaching is worrisome. I hope any young coach who has managed to read this far is one who can aspire to someday providing the same kind of leadership for the organization from which they are now benefitting. It is awe inspiring to be a new coach to qualify students to the state tournament and come and judge the rounds and perhaps see students succeed. And, perhaps, to also complain about the bad food or the delays in the time

schedule or to not understand what is going on. That is being new. To be in a position to have to make that state tournament work, however, is a whole different matter.

I remember my first three tournaments prior to being elected to be an Area Chairperson. I knew very little about the whole process. I went. I judged. I complained about delays and the bad food. The fourth year I had the task of assigning judges. Some of my fellow coaches came to tell me I had been elected to the Area II Chair position. I said, "The what?" Yes. That is how much I knew. I have learned a considerable amount since then.

Scholarships

Since the 1990 California State Speech Tournament, the California High School Speech Association (CHSSA) has contributed over \$85,000 in scholarship aid to state champions in every event at the state tournament. The scholarship awards were begun in 1990 through the generosity of many coaches who contributed money to establish a trust fund. Since that time \$150-\$500 for each winner in each event was placed into the scholarship fund from state tournament entry fees.

Many students have been repeat state champions over a span of several years and have received multiple awards. There are several three-time champions who received three awards for their outstanding effort and consistency. In past years, checks were sent directly to the financial aid office of the university where the student was accepted.

Beginning with state 2015, however, checks for \$250 per champion are paid directly to the student.

Because of special donations, students sometimes receive higher awards. Beginning this year, a special \$1000 scholarship will be awarded each year to a student at the state tournament in honor of Hall of Fame coach Lynette Williamson.







REMEMBER WHEN

By Ron Underwood, CHSSA Historian and Hall of Fame member

Fifty-five years ago - The President was Mary Ritter of Modesto High School. At the State Tournament (UCSB) there were 18 entries from the north and 18 entries from the south. The fees were \$3 per entry . In team debate (the only debate) your team could consist of 2,3 or 4 members. A motion that the State Tournament alternate between the north and the south was defeated. State tournament awards cost \$220. (Today – Approx \$14,000)

Fifty years ago - The President was James O'Banion of McLane High in Fresno. There were 400 schools active in CHSSA. This was the last state Tournament to be held at UCSB. At the four best hotels for state a room for four ran \$18. CHSSA council voted to alternate the State Tournament, north-south.

Forty-five years ago - The President was Donovan Cummings of Edison High in Stockton. Prior to the State Tournament (held at USF), Father Dempsey (USF Forensic Director) told us all "everything is going well" and we should all stay at the Jack Tar Hotel... State Tournament went to three days (instead of two.) Awards cost \$1250.

Thirty-five years ago - The President was Robert Jones of Fresno High. The tournament was at UOP in Stockton. The original ten members of the CHSSA Hall of Fame were inducted at the Awards' Assembly. The first tournament dance was held with arrangements made by Lodi High's Tom Montgomery. Awards were added for coaches of first place winners.

Twenty-five years ago - The President was Jack Stafford or Del Norte High School and the tourney was held at San Jose State. The "Rodney King Riots" affected the State Tournament. One of the prelim rounds of I.E. was cancelled and a late evening rounds of debate were held at the hotel. First time we had eighteen contestants in the semi -finals.

Fifteen years ago - The President was John Cardoza and the tournament was at Buchanan High School in Clovis. This was the year computers were introduced to state tournament operations.


