Since 2006 the Lowell High School speech and debate program has been a bedrock of success, poportunity, and excellence in the speech and debate community, thanks to the hard work of head coach, and most importantly, Lowell alumni:

Terence "Terry" Abad. Terry's sixteen years of commitment to speech and debate have been filled with competitive success, leadership roles, and friendships that e

xtend beyond forensics. This year, the California High School Speech Association is proud to welcome Terry Abad as the 2023 CHSSA Hall of Fame inductee.

When talking about Terry one common thread pops up among everyone who knows him: Terry is always willing to step up when he is needed. This has lead to Terry serving as the Golden Gate Speech Association league president (2008 - 2016), District Chair for the NSDA San Francisco Bay District, the head of the judge room at the James Logan Invitational tournament for many years, and as state tournament host in 2012 when Terry hosted at

Lowell High School. In that time Terry has always worked hard to innovate, including being the first state tournament host to bring in food trucks for attendees, a practice that is now copied year after year! Indeed, this leadership role comes naturally to Terry.

In fact, when the California High School Speech Association needs someone to lead a vote process, it is Terry who gets the call because everyone knows he is reliable, and has the relationship with his fellow coaches to get the job finished. More than 60 Lowel I students have competed at the state tournament during his tenure, including the 2016 Parliamentary Debate champions and the 2017 runners-up."

Within the coaching community Terry has left an impact as someone who is always ready to provide a dose of integrity, positivity and joy into everyone's day. Hall of Fame coach Mikendra McCoy explains that "Terry remembers names and faces, he always engages with questions about your person, then your
